

# spa installation guide

## Delivery route

Consider the following when planning your delivery route:

- Check you have the manpower available for positioning the spa in your desired location. In most cases a minimum of 2 able bodied people will be required to help lift your spa along the access route (please discuss this further with your salesperson).
- Check the width of gates, doors and sidewalks to make sure your spa will pass through unobstructed.
- If the delivery route will require a 90 degree turn, check the measurements at the turn to ensure the spa will fit.
- Are there protruding gas meters, water meters or overhead obstructions which will complicate the delivery path?
- Are there steps along the delivery path? If so, more manpower will be required.

## Electrical requirements

It is your responsibility to contact, organise and pay for a Registered Electrical Contractor to install all relevant power requirements to your spa. The spa must be installed by a Registered Electrical Contractor in accordance with New Zealand Electrical Regulations.

NOTE- Most spas require a dedicated 15-32 amp power supply with a waterproof power outlet or an IP56 isolator switch hardwired to your main switchboard. A correctly rated RCD/MSB (Residual Current Device/Miniature Circuit Breaker) safety switch is also required at the main switchboard. Your dealer can supply you with the power requirements for your new spa.

# spa installation guide

Owning a spa is fun, relaxing and therapeutic. Proper location and installation of your new spa will ensure years of enjoyment and relaxation. Here are some helpful installation guides for new Club members:

## Location

Think about the positioning of the spa for all seasons. What might be a very private area during the summer could be very exposed when the trees are bare in the winter.

If you live in a cold or hot climate, a place to change clothes or house entry nearby is convenient. A hot climate may also require shade from the hot sun. Consider placement of trees, a cantilever umbrella, shade sails or a gazebo to provide protection from the sun.

We recommend that you have storage space nearby, preferably a locked cupboard, for keeping chemicals safe from children but close enough for easy maintenance. Do not store chemicals inside your spa cabinet.

## Access for Service

Your spa will be fitted with a drain and hose connection which will need to be easily accessed at periodic intervals. This drain has a hose fitting connection for ease of draining.

Your spa must be installed so as to permit easy access to the equipment service panels located around the perimeter of your spa. Make certain that there are no obstructions and a clear working area of at least 500mm to all sides of the spa.

## Keep your Spa clean

Prevent dirt and foliage from being tracked into your spa by utilizing concrete for paths and access areas. Check the location of trees and spill paths from gutters to see if wind or rain will sweep debris into your spa.

## Spa Foundation

Your spa needs a good solid foundation. The area that your spa sits on must be able to support the weight of 500kg/ square metre. If the foundation is inadequate, it may shift or settle after the spa is in place, causing stress to the shell. A base of 100mm (4") minimum concrete pad (or equivalent) is required to place your spa upon. Decking, paving stones and bricks are also acceptable provided they are properly constructed. If your proposed site is a deck and you are unsure if the decking is strong enough it is recommended that you consult an architect or a structural engineer. Never place your spa directly on grass or soil. Place the spa on an elevated foundation so that water drains away from it. Proper drainage will keep components dry from rain and wet weather and also aid you when draining the spa for maintenance.
